### MRES Annual Meeting- May 10-11, 2023

Director of Public Services Crocker shared with the Utility Commission the Annual MRES Meeting on May 10-11th held in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. Commissioner Karlgaard offered a motion to have sending Commission members open to whomever is available and would like to attend the meeting along with Public Service Director, Neil Crocker. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Graves and carried unanimously.

#### **EVA Charger/LM (Load Management) Discussion**

Director Crocker shared with the Utility Commission that there have been several inquiries regarding Level 2 EV chargers. The discussion and concern is how does BPU want to manage EV chargers relative to our Load management system. Director Crocker reached out to MRES as well as the cities of Detroit Lakes and Staples for input. Input from these cities is to have EV chargers on a system that can be controlled by the Utility. Commissioner Summerville discussed some potential challenges regarding various wiring possibilities to existing homes vs new construction homes. No formal action was taken on the subject but it was unanimously agreed upon that having control over these chargers will be in the best interest of BPU. It was also agreed upon that a transition to partial AMI would be the first step to resolving these types of issues in the future.
