Crew Updates:

Electric:

- Director Crocker informed members that the crew has started their underground wiring project. Scott's Electric will be gone on another project for the next two weeks though but they will have plenty of prep work to do while they are gone.
- With the high winds last week there was a tree that caused a small outage. Water
- They opened up the ponds this weekend to release again. The ponds are now shut off until the fall.
- Crews have been jetting sewers.

<u>Electric Department Staffing</u>. The electric department had two interns here for a few weeks but are now working elsewhere where they will work 1000 hours. Once they have their 1000 hours in at the end of the summer, they will be laid off again. Neil would like to potentially hire one of them as an apprentice at \$25/hr until Jim Weatherstone retires (Neil thinks it will be next April). They will not have their journeyman status, but they will be getting some experience here.

Easton will not get his journeyman until about six months after Jim retires but at least they will have a path leading to having two journeyman again. The apprentices are not allowed to work on live wires so some of the outages may be a little longer than they are now. If we are lucky enough to have an interested journeyman come to Breckenridge, we certainly wouldn't turn them away. Just an FYI – Ivan Crocker in the water department also has his Apprentice Lineman license.

Other.

- Three applicants were received for the Water/Wastewater position. One has their class C & D license in Texas and Minnesota. Interviews are being set up now.
- The jetter had a mishap last week. Neil got it fixed for now. They got a demo from a new one last week which was very impressive. The jetter gets used quite a bit. He is going to put in to purchase a new jetter next year which is about \$100,000. The old one is around 25 years old. Dennis inquired about each department putting away \$10,000 per year for these types of things. Neil will look into that as well as what each funds balance is.

• Neil informed the Commission that he is officially giving his one-year notice. He will be retiring May 19, 2026.
