Call to Order

Shawn called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM.

Approval of Minutes: Reed offered a motion to approve the minutes from the March 11th, 2020, meeting. The motion was seconded by Neil and carried unanimously.

Activities / Improvements for Breckenridge:

Nothing new at this time.

Pickleball Update

Neil informed the committee that the contractor has been working at the location for the last week and half on leveling and painting the surface. They will be doing the striping in the next few days. Once the surface is ready, they will install the nets.

This is an exciting addition to Breckenridge. Neil has even had a few people call from other towns wondering when the courts will be ready.

Bike Maintenance Station & Air Pump Update

Neil has placed the order for the FIXIT station and the Air Kit 3. There was no expected delivery date, due to COVID-19. The application was submitted to PartnerSHIP 4 Health for funding. Once the items arrive, they will be installed at the "start" of the path, located by Veteran's Memorial Park. Neil will keep the committee posted as to when it is installed. Daily News contacted Patrick regarding an article. Patrick would like to wait until they are installed, Paige agreed.

National Night Out

Kris informed the committee that they will not be hosting National Night Out in August for sure, due to COVID-19 and the current restrictions. There is a possibility of having the event on October 6th. This will all depend on the COVID-19 guidelines at the time.

Headwaters Day

Lisa from Wahpeton Breckenridge Area Chamber of Commerce has suggested that the decision be made by City of Breckenridge and Active Living Committee, due to COVID-19 and the current restrictions. The current restrictions are 250 people and that is not feasible at this time.

Other Business

-Deb gave the committee an update on Wilkin County COVID-19 situation. She reminded everyone to be careful and mindful, to stay home when you're sick and to wash your hands.

- Safe Routes to School- Neil is going to contact the state regarding the changes discussed (adding one-way street vs. adding sidewalks). There needs to be input from the state before we can move forward with this project. Neil will keep the committee updated.
- Corinna informed the committee that there is no update for the upcoming school year. They are waiting on guidance.
- Neil and Kris stated that City Hall is now open to the public as of Monday, June 8th, with social distancing and current regulations in place. There are small meetings (less than 10 people) taking place at City Hall; all other meetings are still being held via teleconference.
- 3-wheeled bikes and disc golf sets are available for rental at City Hall.
- If the committee members have any ideas for the upcoming agenda, please email Lori or Shawn.
- Patrick informed the committee that PartnerSHIP 4 Health does have a few projects going on, and meetings are being held via teleconference.
