



REPORT - SEPTEMBER ACTIVITIES

September 6 - Rummage Sale - The Community was asked to donate stuff to the rummage sale rather than having a rummage sale. The community came through again, we had more stuff donated this rummage sale then we ever have.

We had 12-15 people come to help putting stuff on the tables and boxing things after the sale that was not sold. The number of shoppers on Saturday was up, we had people in the center all day even the last hour.

We sold a total of \$1,690.45 stuff on Saturday. The expense was \$175. for advertising in the Daily News and on KBMW.

The profit for this rummage sale is \$1,515.65.

September 9 - Pot Luck Supper - We had Pot Luck on Tuesday, Sept. 9 with 23 people in attendance. We had time to visit with other members of the center and have a very good meal.

September 9 - Breckenridge Public School District Proposal was presented to people in attendance at the pot luck supper by Superintendent Kristie Sullivan.

Kristie presented the proposal that will be voted on November 4th, at the Breckenridge High School. I feel Kristie did a great job informing the people in attendance how they came up with this proposal and what the proposal was.

Approval of Bond issue and Capital
Project Levy Authorization

The school board of Independent School District NO. 846 (Breckenridge Public Schools) has proposed a project for the acquisition and betterment of school sites and facilities, including safety and security improvements at school sites and facilities; the construction and equipping an elementary school addition to the high school building; replacement of the existing bus garage; deferred maintenance, repair and renovation projects at school sites and facilities: the acquisition, installation, replacement, support and maintenance of software, educational software, software licenses, computers, improved technology equipment, networks, infrastructure,

the costs of technology related personnel and training; the purchase and replacement of school buses and school related transportation vehicles; and the acquisition of curriculum textbooks and materials.

To provide funds for a portion of the project cost, the school board has proposed to issue general obligation school building bonds in an amount not to exceed \$58,000,000. To provide funds for the remaining portion of the project costs, the school board has proposed a capital project levy authorization in the amount of 3.553% times the net tax capacity of the school district. The proposed capital project levy will raise approximately \$600,000. For taxes payable in 2026, the first year it is to be levied, and would be authorized for ten (10) years. The estimated total cost of the projects to be funded by the capital project to be funded by the capital project levy authorization is approximately \$6,000,000. The project to be funded have received a positive Review and Comment from the Commissioner of Education.
