The items **NOT** accepted: Hazardous waste, metal, dirt, industrial waste, chemical products, oil filters, herbicides and pesticides, radioactive materials, solvents, paint (except completely dried latex paint cans, no liquids), other flammable liquids, aerosol cans, propane tanks, tires, tire inner tubes, motor oil, transmission oil/lubricating/hydraulic oil/oil filters, contaminated oils (mixed with solvents, gasoline, etc.), antifreeze, appliances (fridge, freezer, washer/dryer, air conditioner, etc.), batteries, electronics (TVs, monitors, computers, etc.), fluorescent tubes, railroad ties, medical waste, asbestos, animals, barrels, all liquids.

WATER CONSERVATION REMINDER:

NEVER use the toilet to dispose of trash! The bathroom accounts for almost 70% of water usage in average homes.

REMINDER TO ALL DOG OWNERS:

1. DOGS LICENSE IS REQUIRED- Ordinance §54-3

-No person shall keep or harbor any dog within the limits of Breckenridge unless such dog is properly licensed.

-License tags shall be issued annually for a one-year period. No household shall keep or maintain more than three licensed dogs. The license fee for each dog is \$10 & can be purchased at Breckenridge City Hall: information needed- resident name, phone #, address, name of pet, sex, color, breed, rabies #.

2. OWNER MUST MAINTAIN CONTROL OF DOGS- Ordinance §54-8

-Effectively contained, restrained or confined within a fenced area, by voice control, or by other means on the owner's property;

-Effectively restrained by chain, cord or leash to private property with the consent of the property owners;

-Effectively restrained by a chain, cord or leash not exceeding six feet in length or by a "flexi-lead" or similar device when located on any street, public grounds, or other location besides the owner's property.

3. DANGEROUS & POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS ANIMALS- Ordinance §54-27

-When unprovoked, bites or inflicts injury to a person or a domestic animal.

-When unprovoked, engages in behavior that constitutes a physical threat of bodily harm to a person or domestic animal or poses an immediate threat to public safety.

-When unprovoked, repeatedly attacks a person or domestic animal.

Know what's below.
Call before you dig.

1. **Notify** your local one call center by calling 811 (800-252-1166) making the request 2-3 days before work begins.
2. **Wait** the required amount of time for affected utility operators to respond to your request.
3. **Confirm** that all affected utility operators have responded to your request & marked underground utilities.
4. **Respect** the marks.
5. **Dig Carefully** around the marks with care.
